Family Foodbank Support

To help support residents in need during the Spring lockdown, we donated £5,000 to the Family Food Bank in Ashford, enough for 600 food parcels, of about 32 meals each.

Volunteer Litter Pickers

Volunteers remain busy. The team at Boughton Lees (second Saturday, monthly at 11am) have resumed litter picks, when permitted, with each member using equipment assigned to them individually. A new group was formed for the Trinity Road area. The first pick was carried out in February and 25 bags were filled, plus tyres, metal and wheel hubs.

Snakes & Scarecrows

A fantastic COVID-19 painted rock snake wove along the path outside Goat Lees Primary School during the lockdown period. It then slithered into the school for safe-keeping and will be kept there as a special way to remember the year 6 children who moved on to new schools this summer. These children were the very first reception children to join the new school.

There couldn't be a Pleasure Fayre this year, but the inaugural Boughton Lees Scarecrow Safari was held in July and proved a massive hit. Money raised from donations will go to the Pleasure Fayre fund, used to maintain the Iron Room and village green.

Eureka Park Planning

The Parish Council will be meeting the developers of Eureka Park to highlight community concerns and ask questions regarding their plans for the next stage of development around the lakes.

Traffic and Highways

KCC have introduced a scheme to work with parish councils to create Highway Improvement Plans. These will help decide on traffic and safety priorities for the local area, using data about the roads around us. A group of Councillors are working on a plan for our parish.
